Rothenstein became one of the most experimental printmakers in Britain during the '50s and '60s. As well as found objects such as wood offcuts and metal debris, he incorporated fresh 20th century imagery into his relief prints, combining photographic material with traditional woodcuts and linocuts. Numerous major galleries currently hold his work and he was made Hon. RE and elected RA in 1983.

In 'Black and Orange' the artist used seven colours: black, orange, brown, red, yellow, blue and beige. Green was also produced by the overlapping of blue and yellow. The beige ground was printed from inked linen to give the image a textured quality.

In 1946, with his first editioned print – Timber Felling in Essex, produced for the School Prints initiative – he decided to venture fully into the world of the printmaking. After a flurry of experimental works produced with the help of outside printers, in 1954 Rothenstein established his own studio in Great Bardfield where he began to produce from his own presses.

Of the artists who lived in Great Bardfield, Essex between 1930 and 1970, Michael Rothenstein was often regarded as the most avant-garde, which is demonstrated in the Gallery's collection of his work as a painter of figurative and abstract subjects in oils, watercolour, collage, mixed media, in the assemblages he constructed, and as an innovative printmaker which he developed after 1948.

During the 1890s Rothenstein direct contact with wood was sought again, alongside drawings of the simplest kind. The chosen wood was up to 1985 parana pine which has a straight close-grained surface without all the interruptions of knots and irregularities found in elm wood. When printed it gives a smooth distinct solid black.
